Summer Art Camp 2022 Family Handbook

Camp is offered to children from 8 to 14 years old

TUITION AND FEES

Summer Art camp is \$200 per week. Payable online (preferred), via check made out to "GNAL" with the camper's name written in the memo section, or cash.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

Camp begins at 10am and dismisses PROMPTLY at 2pm, Monday through Friday

Drop-off procedure:

Summer art camp entrance is at the back door which is in the back parking lot. Entrance to this lot is on the left side of the building. Please use caution when entering and exiting the back parking lot as it is very narrow. Please be patient as some cars will be dropping off and some will be leaving at the same time using the narrow driveway. We apologize for the inconvenience, however, due to COVID safety measures, we feel this is the most appropriate procedure. We strongly encourage you to park on SANDRA LANE, which is right near the Art Center, and follow the path up the small stairs and to the property. This is a much safer way to drop off your child as, once again, our driveway is very narrow.

Please park and accompany your child with masks on to the back door (there may be a line due to distancing). Hand sanitizer will be put on your child's hands while the child's temperature is taken at the door with a forehead thermometer. If your child's temperature is not elevated, you will be given the go-ahead to leave. The campers will then enter into the main room where they will wash their hands, and find their assigned table, which will have their name on it.

Pick up procedure:

Your child will be picked up at the front entrance of our building. You must come up to the front porch and announce your name to the teacher. The teacher will then escort your child to the front door. Since our front parking lot only has a few spaces, we strongly encourage you to park on SANDRA LANE, which is right near the Art Center, and follow the path up the small stairs and to the front porch. This is a much safer way to pick up your child as, once again, our driveway is very narrow.

HEALTH AND HYGIENE-PROCEDURES

Admittance: If a child is at high-risk for contracting a severe illness such as COVID-19, it is recommended that they not enroll in this program. (This is a CDC recommendation.)

Daily home health check: Each day parents should check their child's temperature and general health before sending them to Summer Camp. If a child shows symptoms of illness, keep him/her home.

Handwashing: Children will wash hands when they come into the building, after using the bathroom, and as needed. Hands will be washed with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Hand sanitizer will be used as needed..

Mask wearing: Each child is required to wear a face mask each day.

Social distancing: While physical distancing is recommended when possible, there will be times when children are within 6 feet of each other. Physical distancing will not always be possible.

Illness Procedure: If your child is ill we will be calling you to pick them up and you will be expected to be available.

COVID- 19: In the event that a child or staff member is found to have contracted the COVID 19 virus, the following will take place:

All Camp families and staff will be notified.

The Department of Health and PA Department of Human Services (DHS) will be notified, if appropriate.

Admission/Exclusion due to symptoms of illness

Children who are obviously ill with fever, diarrhea, vomiting, green-runny nose, puss/oozing eyes, disease or condition (i.e.- ringworm, head lice, chicken pox, measles, mumps, pink eye, fever over 100 degrees, etc.) will not be admitted to the program. It is a danger to other children and staff members at our facility.

The child will be permitted to return when his/her temperature is normal for 24 hours without aid of fever-reducing medication. Your child must have any prescribed medication, such as antibiotics, in his/her system for at least 24 hours before returning.

If a child is showing COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, runny nose, shortness of breath) OR if you've been in close contact with a person or child testing positive for COVID- 19, we ask you to keep your child home.

They must be isolated for a minimum of 7 days after symptom onset, and 72 hours after their fever resolves without fever-reducing medicines. (For example, if symptoms and fever resolve on day 7, the person can return on day 10.) For most, this will be 14 days after the household contact with COVID-19. We ask that all parents and staff let us know of any potential exposure immediately. A potential exposure means being a household contact or having close contact within 6 feet of an individual with confirmed or suspected COVID- 19 for at least 10 minutes. The timeframe for having

contact with an individual includes the period of 48 hours before the individual became symptomatic.

GENERAL POLICIES

Please check your email or cell phone each day before camp to assure that we have not tried to communicate important messages to you in the morning regarding camp that day.

Seating: Each child has an assigned seat all week where they will be doing their activities and eating their lunches.

Visitors: No visitors will be allowed in the building.

Food: Campers are to bring a bagged lunch and a beverage each day. There is a refrigerator for lunches if needed.

Water bottles: Each child should bring their own full water bottle each day (labeled with name).

Allergies: It is up to the parent to let the staff know if their child has life threatening allergies before camp begins so that we can alert all families. Email gnartleague@gmail.com with any allergies at least one week before the start of camp.

Clothing: Please dress your child in practical clothing that allows for freedom of movement and is appropriate for paint, clay and other art mediums. Art materials may permanently stain clothing.

Outdoor activities: The camp instructor will use discretion on whether or not to include any outdoor activities during the camp day. These activities will be held in the back parking lot.

Injuries: First aid will be administered by a staff member in the event that your child sustains a minor injury (e.g., scraped knee). The classroom is equipped with a first aid kit.

In the event of a serious medical emergency we will call 9-1-1 and the child may be taken to the hospital immediately by ambulance, while we contact you or an emergency contact.

Respectful Behavior: All children and caregivers will be treated with respect and dignity. In return, we expect the same from all of our families. We will not tolerate hostile or aggressive behavior. If this occurs, we reserve the right to ask you to control your behavior or to remove your children from our care.

Child Custody: Without a court document, all guardians listed have equal rights to custody. We are legally bound to respect the wishes of the parent/guardian with legal custody based on a certified copy of the most recent court order, active restraining order, or court-ordered visitation schedule. We will not

accept the responsibility of deciding which parent/guardian has legal custody where there is no court documentation. Please inform GNAL of any special custody situations. Email gnartleague@gmail.com

Fire Safety: Our Summer Camp is equipped with fire alarms, emergency lights, and fire extinguishers. Our fire evacuation plan is reviewed with the children and staff.
